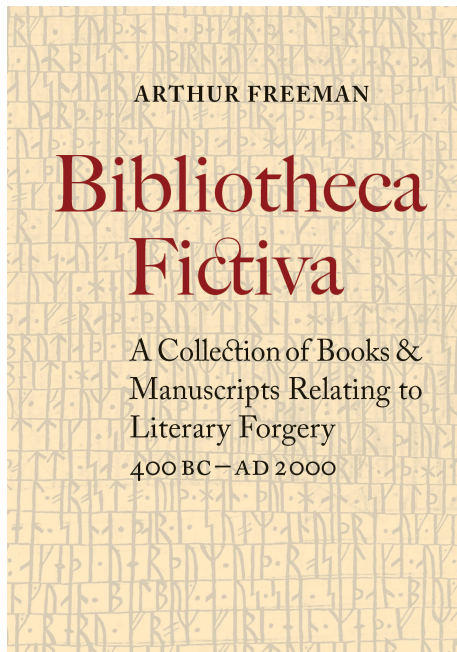

He is the author of *Thomas Kyd: Facts and Problems* (1966), *Elizabeth's Misfits* (1978), *Anatomy of an Auction* (1990), and *John Payne Collier: Scholarship and Forgery in the Nineteenth Century* (2 vols, 2004; co-winner of the ILAB Bibliography Prize for 2000–04), the last two with his wife Janet Ing Freeman; and some eighty critical and bibliographical articles, as well as seven volumes of verse and a (pseudonymous) novel about sinister aspects of the rare book trade.
